A large assortment of residential camps that offer overnight camp experiences will be in attendance on Jan. 27 at Junior League New Orleans Headquarters, 4319 Carondelet St., New Orleans from 6 to 8 p.m. Area families who are considering sleep-away camps for their child or children in the upcoming summer of 2009 are invited to attend and have all of their questions answered in one convenient location.

Currently, the following camps are participating: Camp Olympia; Camp Stewart; Heart of the Hills; Glen Arden; and Lookout Mountain.

Attendance is free to the public.
