**JUNIOR LEAGUE OF NEW ORLEANS TO AWARD
COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE FUND GRANTS TO LOCAL
NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS**

Deadline to submit applications is January 20

December 13, 2016, New Orleans, LA – The Junior League of New Orleans (JLNO) is currently accepting applications from local nonprofit organizations for Community Assistance Fund (CAF) grants. The deadline for submissions is Friday, January 20, 2017. Grants will be paid in May 2017.

Applicants may be granted up to \$20,000. Organizations will be chosen based on their ability to advance the wellbeing of women in one or more of the following ways:

- Enhancing economic opportunities for women and supporting women’s potential to seize those opportunities
- Improving women’s health and wellness, allowing them to enjoy dynamic and happy lives
- Providing needed family support to alleviate the burdens on women caregivers

“JLNO believes that every woman in Metropolitan New Orleans should have the opportunity to live a healthy, happy and successful life,” said JLNO President Maria Pardo Huete. “We’re excited to see the increased impact that these organizations will have in our communities by using the CAF grant to advance the wellbeing of women.”

JLNO has awarded over \$313,000 in CAF grants to nonprofit organizations since 2007.

JLNO strives to make a difference in the community by promoting the potential of women through voluntarism and leadership development. With a membership of over 2,200, JLNO is the 8th largest Junior League in the world.

During the past three years, JLNO has invested more \$240,000 and approximately 135,000 volunteer hours in the Metropolitan New Orleans area.
